

Lecturer

I teach Old Testament Introduction and Survey; New Testament Introduction and Survey; Integrated Studies 313 &, 412; Religious Education and Theology; Teaching Theology in African Context; Introduction to Philosophy; and Introduction to Political Science. I advise students in their respective areas of study within the School of Arts and Humanities, attend Departmental meetings; Write Course outlines, teach, Set Final Examinations, assess students' performances, meet in the Departmental meetings for Moderation of exams, write Semester's report and submit grades to the Department. I teach in the School of Arts and Humanities, in the Department of Theology and Pastoral Studies.

Biography:

I am a Kenyan by birth and residence, born at Kikambala in Kilifi County on the 13th Day of the third Month of the year 1953. In 1972 immediately after my Secondary Education, I went to train as a Church Minister at the Baptist Theological Seminary in Arusha. In 1976 immediately after graduation I worked as a Church Planter in the land of the Wagiryama People of the Coast of Kenya. In 1977 I became the Pastor of Kisauni Baptist Church in Mombasa. In 1978, a year later, I was employed as a Radio Program producer. A year later, I began teaching Christian Doctrines through Cassette Ministry at the then Baptist Communications

	Nairobi from 1978 to 1980. I was sponsored by the First Baptist Church, in Edna Texas for my further studies in the US. On my return after my studies in the US, I served as the Director for Nairobi Baptist Center, at Shaurimoyo in Nairobi from 1988-1990. I joined the International Baptist Theological Seminary of Eastern Africa as a teacher and became the Academic Dean from 1990 – 1994. I worked as Pastor in the following Baptist Churches: Kisauni Baptist Church, Mombasa; Shaurimoyo Baptist Church, Nairobi; Kahawa West Baptist Church, in Nairobi. When I joined Daystar University, I volunteered and conducted Bible Study groups for Kenya Redeemed Church, Kitengela; Try Jesus Ministry at Devki; Kenya Assemblies of God at Noonkopir in Kitengela; and New Light in Christ Church, Kitengela. Currently I teach Bible Study in my home for the Community.
