University Governance

Daystar University is governed by several governance organs, which we outline below.

Daystar Company Limited/University Sponsor

This body is a company limited by guarantee (without shareholding) and is the University Sponsor. It draws members from diverse Christian denominations and positions of leadership.

The Sponsor has provision for up to 21 members. It has a Board of Directors whose role is the same as the Trustees envisioned in Section 35 of the Universities Act No 42 of 2012. The Board of Directors has 9 members, who are appointed from among the Sponsor's members, with a 3-year term, renewable once.

The Sponsor is responsible for maintaining and upholding the vision and mission of the University, engaging in resource mobilization for the University, and appointing the the University Chancellor and the University Council. The Board meets quarterly, besides an annual general meeting for members.

The Company is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. There is also a Trust Declaration governing the trust relationship between the Sponsor and the University, which is registered with the government.

University Chancellor

The University Chancellor is the titular head of the University. The appointment of this office is a 5-year term, renewable once. The role of the Chancellor is captured in the Universities Act No. 42 of 2012, together with the Charter of Daystar University.

University degrees/certificates are awarded by the Chancellor, who presides over the graduation ceremony.

The Chancellor is appointed by the Sponsor.

University Council

The University Council is a body of 9 - 11 individuals who are appointed by the University Sponsor. They are responsible for appointing staff (Management Board), approving the University statutes, budgets and policies.

The members hold office for a 3-year term, renewable once. It has 5 standing committees, namely:

- Academic, Research and Student Affairs
- Spiritual Nurture and Human Resource
- Resource Mobilization
- Finance
- Audit, Risk & Governance

The committees meet quarterly and report to the Council.

The Council is governed by the Charter, Statutes and Policies of the University and reports to the Sponsor.

The Chair of Council sits as an ex-officio member of the Sponsor.

Vice Chancellor

The Vice Chancellor is the Chief Executive Officer of the University and is the Chair of the University Senate and the University Management Board. The Vice Chancellor also has a division which houses various offices such as Audit, Chaplaincy, Corporate Affairs, various Directorates, Legal/General Counsel, Resource Mobilization and special offices.

The Vice Chancellor is the Secretary to the Council and sits as an ex-officio member of the Sponsor.

The Vice Chancellor's office is governed by the Charter, Statutes and policies of the University and reports to the Council.

University Senate

This is the body of the University responsible for the academic, research and student affairs of the University.

This body is responsible for approval of academic programs, student matters, development of policies and other issues that pertain to learning and the academic arm of the University.

Members of the Senate are included in the Charter of Daystar University and includes, but is not limited to the Deans of Schools, Directors, Principals, Registrars, Librarian, Heads of Departments, Managers, Staff and Student representatives. There is approximately 50 members of the Senate.

The Chair of Senate is the Vice Chancellor, and the Secretary is the Deputy Vice Chancellor – Academic, Research and Student Affairs.

The Senate is governed by the Charter, Statutes and Policies of the University. It receives oversight from the University Council, through the Council committees. The Senate has oversight of the various Academic Schools and Directorates.

The University has 3 campuses – the Main Campus at Athi River, an affiliate Campus at Nairobi, and the Online Campus. The Nairobi Campus is headed by a Principal, while the Athi River Campus and the Online Campus are each headed by a director.

Both the University, overall, and the Nairobi Campus specifically have Academic Division Boards which are a clearing house for various academic matters, that are then brought to the attention of the Senate for discussion and/or approval.

University Management Board

This is the body responsible for the day-to-day management and administration of the University.

The members are set out in the Charter of Daystar including, but not limited to the Vice Chancellor, Deputy Vice Chancellors, Principals, Registrars and Managers of Finance, Human Resource and Legal. There are 9 members of the Management Board.

The Chair of the Management Board is the Vice Chancellor, and the Secretary is the Deputy Vice Chancellor – Finance, Administration and Planning.

The Management Board is governed by the Charter, Statutes and Policies of the University. It receives oversight from the University Council, through the Council committees.

Reporting to the Management Board are various departments and committees which serve as clearing houses for operational, financial, administrative and staff matters. These are then brought to the attention of the Management Board for discussion and/or approval.

Daystar University Students' Association (DUSA)

As per the Universities Act, and the Charter and Statutes, the University has a Student Association. DUSA is headed by a Council and has a Congress which includes representatives of each school/faculty and both campuses.

Among other duties, the responsibility of the student government is to facilitate the academic, social and physical welfare of students, facilitate communication with the administration on behalf of the student body, organize and coordinate student activities.

DUSA is governed by a constitution which is contained in the University Statutes.

Daystar University Alumni Association (DUAA)

Daystar University recognizes the importance of its alumni and has established the DUAA as outlined in the Universities Act, Charter, and Statutes. The association is led by a Board and operates through various regional chapters formed on the basis of graduation year, region, country, or shared interests. Members are free to join any chapter of their choice.

The DUAA is dedicated to fostering connections among alumni and supporting the advancement of Daystar University. It focuses on resource mobilization, development, and alumni relations, strengthening ties across churches, workplaces, and society.

Guided by a vision to be a professional, Christ-centered advancement team, DUAA facilitates alumni engagement while supporting Daystar University's mission and promoting meaningful relationships within the alumni network.

DUAA is governed by a constitution which is contained as part of the University Statutes.

Other bodies

The University has various other bodies such as staff associations. These bodies are governed within the Statutes of Daystar University and their respective charters/constitutions.

Directorate of Academic Affairs

Dr. Dinah Keino, PhD Director Academic Affairs (DAA) and Ag. Director, ODEL

The Directorate of Academic Affairs (DAA) oversees the effective implementation of the University's Academic programs, promotes Problem Based Learning (PBL) as a teaching method in the university, monitors implementation of collaboration and linkages, and supports student welfare by boosting engagement, retention, and ensuring academic integrity and quality is maintained.

DAA reports to the DVC-ARSA and works closely with Deans, Directors, departmental heads, faculty, and administrative units. The Director of Academic Affairs is central to shaping and maintaining the academic mission of the university.

Functions of DAA

The roles and responsibilities of DAA are:

Academic Policy review & implementation - Ensuring that all Academic Policies (e.g. Examinations, Appeals, And Disciplinary Procedures etc) are implemented and continuously reviewed.

Academic Collaborations and linkages-monitoring implementation of collaborations, student exchange, teaching and learning and Faculty exchange policies.

Curriculum Oversight - ensuring academic programs are current, competitive, and aligned with institutional goals.

Faculty support - ensuring a conducive teaching and learning environment.

Academic Advising and Mentorship - coordinating academic advisory structures, and ensuring students receive proper guidance and mentorship.

Enhancing student (Support Services) - Working with Deans of Schools and Office of the University Registrar to oversight student performance, retention and progression.

Student Feedback and Representation - Working with student bodies or representatives to gather feedback on academic issues and incorporate student perspectives into academic planning and decision-making.

Faculty Support - The Director may be involved in faculty orientation, professional development initiatives, support teaching excellence and promote academic research and innovation.

The Directorate of ODeL

The **Directorate of Open, Distance and Electronic Learning (ODeL)** is responsible for leading and managing the university's online and distance education programs. This Directorate that ensures flexible learning opportunities are effectively designed, delivered, and supported to reach a broad and diverse student population through a high-tech Learning Management System (LMS) which assures students of access to quality teaching and learning resources. The Directorate of ODeL was accredited by the Commission for University Education (CUE) as an ODeL Centre in 2022. ODeL fosters diverse learning communities, allowing students to collaborate and learn together, regardless of their geographical locations.

Functions of ODEL Directorate

Strategic Leadership and Management

The Director provides strategic direction for the development and expansion of open, distance, and electronic learning programs, aligning with the university's goals.

Program Development and Coordination

Support in the design, development, and delivery of eLearning courses and programs, ensuring they meet academic standards and cater to the needs of remote learners.

Technology and Infrastructure Oversight

Manages the adoption and maintenance of digital learning platforms, tools, and resources necessary for effective online instruction and student engagement.

Quality Assurance

Works closely with the Director to ensure that ODeL programs are compliant with quality assurance standards and accreditation requirements, maintaining academic rigor and credibility.

Faculty Training and Support

Facilitates training and professional development for academic staff to enhance their skills in eLearning pedagogy, technology use, and online student engagement.

Student Support and Engagement

Develops systems to provide remote learners with academic advising, technical support, and training on use of e-resources to promote successful learner experiences.

Monitoring and Evaluation

Implements mechanisms for monitoring the effectiveness of accredited programs, student performance and satisfaction, and using the data to continuously improve ODEL offerings.



The Media and Film Studies Department (MFS) provides a variety of courses related to journalism and media practice. The department offers all film, media, and journalism courses. The department is led by Dr. Anne Anjao Eboi

Our media hub, situated within the MFS department, includes the Involvement newspaper (both online and print versions), as well as **Shine FM** radio station. *Involvement* is among the oldest student newspapers in Kenya, founded in 1988 as a platform for students to develop their news-writing skills. Its primary goals are to give students experience in journalism and to inform the university community about news within the institution. Shine FM, on the other hand, was established in 2001 as the country's first student radio station. Both media outlets are based at the Main Campus in Athi River. As a student in the SoC, you should aim to write for *Involvement* and work at Shine FM before graduating. Most alumni who worked for either *Involvement* or *Shine FM* have gone on to hold prominent positions in the media.

Additionally, you can enhance your digital media production skills by engaging with the Daystar Production Unit (DPU). Although DPU is part of the Corporate Affairs Department, it mainly works with communication students. You will learn and practice how to create a YouTube video channel and participate in live YouTube coverage of events at Daystar University, such as Prayer Day, Graduation Day, and other important occasions.




Strategic and Organisational Communication Department (STOC)

Registration of Courses and Financial Clearance

- Registration occurs when a student selects their courses, generates an invoice, pays the required amount of fees, and successfully submits the units.
- Students select their classes online from the student portal on the ERP system.
- Once the student selects the classes, the system tabulates an invoice also known as a Proforma invoice which contains details of the courses registered and charges thereof. It is very important for each student to share their proforma invoice with their sponsor/guardian to guide them on the actual fees payable as determined by the classes selected by the student.
- Assistance with student portal access is given by the ICT staff and the University Registrar.
- To register the selected courses, a student must be financially cleared i.e. must have paid their fees in full.
- Fees must be paid within the registration and financial clearance deadlines. For the September 2025 semester, the deadline for financial clearance/Fee payment will be September 26, 2025.
- Fees is chargeable per semester basis as per the attached Fees Structure.

Important note:

The University offers an instalment payment plan which is applicable after completion of the 1st semester.

The current payment plan has three instalments as follows:

- Instalment 1 (50%) Payable at the beginning of the semester prior to course registration.
- Instalment 2 (25%) payable in 30 days after the date of the 1st instalment.
- Instalment 3 (25%) payable in 60 days after the date of the 1st instalment.

An instalment fee of Ksh 2,000 is charged for those opting for the Instalment Plan. Failure to honor Instalment payment by the stated due dates as guided, the Instalment Fee attracts a default fee of Ksh 2,000 for each instalment defaulted.

Methods of Paying Fees:

- **1. Banker's Cheque** payable to Daystar University should be brought to the cash office for issuance of a receipt. Please note, Banker's cheques should not be not be banked. Cheques from foreign countries, Personal or Company Cheques are not an acceptable means of paying fees.
- **2.** Cash Deposits into Daystar University's Bank Account at Co-operative Bank, Athi River Branch A/C No. 01120065209800 or Kenya Commercial Bank (KCB), Capitol Hill Branch A/C No. 1215157754. One can pay at any branch of the KCB or Co-operative Bank.
- **3.** *M-PESA:* The Paybill Business number is 209800; the account number is the student's Admission number exactly as it is, including the hyphen. Once you pay, you will receive a notification on your mobile phone confirming that you have paid to Daystar University.
- **4. Wire Transfer:** This method is also accepted. Please ensure that the student's admission is indicated when paying. However, it will be helpful to send us a copy of the wire transfer so that we can locate the payment in our statement in order to credit the student's account.

5. PDQ Machine: This method is also accepted. Meaning one can swipe either a debit or a credit card to pay school fees at our cash offices either at the Main Campus (Athi River) or Nairobi Campus.

Issuing Receipts:

For Banker's Cheque, a receipt will be issued immediately upon presentation of cheque to the cashier.

Cash Deposits into the account– through Bank or M-PESA, a Receipt will automatically be sent to the student's email. Students also have access to their receipts from the student portal.

6. Financial Aid Scholarships

Daystar University offers Financial Aid scholarships to support financially challenged students from Year Two of their study. Students must apply for both the HELB Loan and the University Scholarship at the beginning of the year (between March and April).

Daystar University scholarships are categorized into two:

- Workstudy Scholarship
- Scheffers Scholarship

These scholarships are designed to help financially challenged students to meet their tuition obligations, while also equipping them with practical experience and mentorship for the job market. Recipients are usually assigned work-study within the university.

Work-study Scholarship

The work-study scholarship is categorized into two types: 75% scholarship and 25% scholarship. The Scholarship is primarily awarded to undergraduate students.

Scheffers Scholarship

The Scheffers Scholarship was established through the generosity of a couple from the United States called Scheffers. The initial donation was placed in an endowment fund, that earns interest which is used to continually support financially challenged students. This is a loan that is repaid through work-study as students continues to study. The Schefers Scholarship is primarily awarded to postgraduate students.

We provide Campus Wi-Fi and high-speed and secure internet connectivity. The University has **two physical libraries and a digital library**, each with a diverse and quality collection of information resources. The resources are purposely selected to cater for all the academic needs of the students and for life-long learning.

The Libraries

Physical Libraries

- The University has two campus libraries: Main (Athi River) Campus Library and Nairobi Campus Library.
- The information resources provided through the physical libraries include print books, audio-visual materials, print journals, magazines, newspapers, reports, theses, and dissertations.
- The Library is fully automated and students can search for the resources through the web-based Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). After the student has searched the OPAC and identified the information item/s a student requires (e.g. a book), the library user will need to visit the physical library to borrow the item. The OPAC is accessible via https://library.daystar.ac.ke/

The Digital Library

- This is a collection of online databases for e-books, e-journals, podcasts, videos, and case studies.
- The digital Library is accesible both on- and off-campus, via https://app.myloft.xyz/user/login
- All new students are oriented on how to use the digital Library.

The Institutional Repository

- The University Library has a Digital Repository (IR), through which
 knowledge generated by the University's community members is archived and
 disseminated. The IR content includes past students' theses and dissertations,
 research articles, conference presentations, books, book chapters, other
 research reports, and past exam papers.

1. Admissions & Registration

A: Please bring your admission letter, national ID/passport (or birth certificate for those under 18), academic certificates, and proof of fee payment.

2. Academic Programs

Q: How do I select or change my course/major?

A: You will receive guidance during Orientation and through your HoD at your School meetings. Course changes are allowed within the first three weeks of the semester, subject to approval.

Q: What is the course load per semester?

A: A full-time student typically takes 15–18 credit hours per semester. Your advisor will help you balance your workload.

3. Orientation & Student Life

Q: What should I expect during Orientation week?

A: Orientation is designed to help you settle in, meet fellow students, and learn about Daystar University's academic and social life. You'll attend information sessions, campus tours, and fellowship events.
