Going forward, you will not have to rely on grades or guidance from instructors to tell you how you are doing and where you stand because your time has come to rely on your inner compass to take you in the right direction. However, to stay on the right course, your inner compass will require constant calibration. See an inaccurate inner compass will turn you into a drifter blown in different direction by every wind. But if your inner compass is accurate it will turn you into a courageous doer, unafraid of the strong winds of opinions and thoughts. You will therefore not sit around waiting for a telephone call, or wait for an opportunity to come, or for your turn, because your inner compass will remind you that your time has come and your time is now.
